

ATELIER AROUND THE WORLD

"Atelier Around the World" is a community outreach visual arts program serving children ages 5 to 16 from primarily low wealth communities. Established in 1993, the youth program is designed to enhance self-esteem and promote cultural awareness through the visual arts.

The year round program has three prongs and utilizes trained artists/professionals and teachers to provide arts instruction and creative activities through: "Adopt a School-Art After School" programs, "Saturday Enrichment" workshops and a three week "Summer Arts Camp". The art after school and Saturday art programs operate for seven months during the school year. Students are exposed to a wide range of artistic processes and techniques including paper making, mask making, collage, crafts, drawing, painting, cartooning, fabric design and construction, sculpture and ceramics. The **Summer Arts Camp** culminates in an exhibition showcasing their work. **This year's exhibition and reception will be June 25, 2010.**

The **African American Atelier, Inc.**, a non-profit art organization, seeks to promote an awareness, appreciation and sensitivity to the visual arts and culture of African Americans and to work in harmony with other ethnic groups.

The French term "Atelier", literally means "in the studio." Founded in 1990, this organization facilitates community involvement and participation in the arts both inside and outside of the studio located in the Greensboro Cultural Center. The Atelier provides a diverse range of exhibits, programs, activities and services for all age groups and ethnic backgrounds. Generally, admission to the gallery and its functions are free to the community and public.

The Atelier exhibits only original art and presents six to eight exhibitions each year in its 2,000 square foot modern facility located in the Greensboro Cultural Center. The exhibition facility is divided into three art gallery areas consisting of a large Main Gallery which showcases the major rotational exhibits and two small art galleries: Atelier's Eva Hamlin Miller Gallery dedicated to Atelier's co-founder and first curator (Eva Hamlin Miller) supports group and solo exhibits held at the facility.

Atelier's Bennett College for Women Gallery provides a creative venue to showcase women artists and artisans while highlighting permanent works from the Bennett College collection. Atelier collaborates with local colleges, universities, community centers and arts agencies throughout the year to deliver services, programs and outreach to the community. The African American Atelier showcases more than fifty artists each year through its solo and group exhibitions and is visited by more than 20,000 guests annually.

MURALS, MINDS & COMMUNITIES

Murals, Minds, and Communities is a three week summer arts camp that provides a creative venue for youth (5-16 years old) to explore hands-on arts and crafts and examine art in public places while exploring multiple artistic mediums. This year's theme is "Social Awareness Through the Visual Arts."

Students will explore composition, design, visual applications and processes of two-dimensional imagery in public art.

Under the direction of an artist/teacher, students plan and prepare a mural for a select community site. An annual exhibition featuring art work created by youth participants culminates the program's year. This year's exhibition and reception will be June 25, 2010.
